A Message from IhsanRD's Team

Today, our services are much more unique, and our ambition is getting higher. Nine years of hard working, Ihsan Relief and Development has gained a great experience as a humanitarian organization. Our response to our families in need has designed our reputation and acceptance among our stakeholders.

What made the year of 2019 special is the diversity and the quality of our services. This year, through our projects, we tasted the crops out of the distributed seeds, and enjoyed the smell of the fresh bread; and as we brought children back to schools, we taught thousands, and also learned from them, we protected hundreds of families and gave children safe spaces, we helped people who displaced from their homes and supported them with the basic needs; we took tens of photos for children sprinkling with clean and safe water, and heard many success stories.



OUR HISTORY


Syrian Forum is a consortium of non profit organizations that started operating in 2011.

- Officially registered in April 2014




AUDIT MANAGEMENT - KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

OUR PROGRAMS



IhsanRD's model exponentially focuses on increasing efficiency and impact when it comes to relief and development services that assist vulnerable familiese. In addition to providing emergency relief, we also uplift thousands of Syrian families through food security and livelihood, shelter, water and sanitation, hygiene activities, women empowerment and child protection programs, education services, agricultural reform, vocational training, and much more.

We use the knowledge and skills that we developed to meet the needs of Syrian people and help them rebuild their lives through our programs:

- Food Security and Livelihoods (FSL) Program
- Protection Program
- Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) Program
- Education Program
- Non-Food Items & Shelter Program





Food Security and Livelihoods (FSL) Program

In IhsanRD, the **food security and livelihood** program targets breaking the chains of hunger and poverty through supporting and sustaining local agriculture by providing key resources, such as seeds, fertilizer, and pesticides necessary for successful farming. We conduct training on Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) to educate farmers, so that we help achieving the overall goal of sustainability by increasing the level of commercialization of agriculture in the early recovery in projects that include, but not limited to, wheat and olive value chain. Through sustainable agriculture, the intervention helps communities develop forms of food production that are economically viable, ecologically sound, socially just, and supportive of rural culture.

We also conduct economically empowering programs to revitalize livelihoods for Syrian families to increase their resilience and to address the gaps of livelihoods and income generation to the most vulnerable households such as livestock breeding support, cash for work, small business grants, entrepreneurship, and food processing projects.

While in emergencies, we quickly identify community needs and respond promptly by distributing ready-to-eat rations and food baskets in addition to multipurpose cash support.





PROTECTION PROGRAM

Child Protection: IhsanRD through its child friendly spaces and teams in Syria provides children in need with improved access to quality protection resources. These spaces provide structured recreational and psycho-social support activities, as well as case management services to affected boys and girls. Our team also manages mobile units to provide recreational psycho-social support activities to children who cannot access these services. These units generally administer services in local schools, mosques, community centers, and camps.

General Protection: IhsanRD started its GP services to provide protection emergency response package during displacements. GP services also include integrated community centers to provide prevention and response activities for men, women, boys, and girls, along with protection legal services including awareness raising, and legal counselling on both Civil Status Documentations, and Housing Land and Properties.

Protection monitoring and protection mainstreaming is a fundamental component of the general protection program through assessing the protection risks, and concerns and developing the intervention accordingly.

Gender-Based Violence: IhsanRD delivers services to survivors of gender-based violence through women and girls' safe spaces, which provide a safe support network, as well as psycho-social services .in addition to women empowerment activities through vocational training. Moreover, IhsanRD provides case management fund to survivors and at-risk cases within individual protection assistant service and cash support for special cases.





WATER, SANITATION, AND HYGIENE (WASH) PROGRAM

IhsanRD, through its **WASH** program, always seeks to provide clean water to maintain good health and fight diseases. In IhsanRD, we intervene in WASH services to protect the public health of displaced people and local communities, and to help protect their right to safe water and sanitation, through the following:

- Off-camp WASH Interventions: Through which we rehabilitate of water systems including water stations and water networks; support operations and maintenance of WASH units in cooperation with local councils by providing incentives, tool kits, fuel, and chlorine; provide alternative power solutions for water systems such as the hybrid power system based on genset and solar power; implement capacity building for water unit staff to operate water systems and establish cost-recovery systems to ensure that communities can continue operating their water systems after lhsanRD withdraws; and rehabilitate sewage systems.
- In-camp WASH Interventions: Through which we provide emergency WASH services in camps and informal settlement such as water trucking, water tanks, small scale repair for water systems and sewage systems, latrines, hygiene supplies etc. and hygiene promotion campaigns.



IhsanRD, through its **education** program, spares no effort to build a sustainable future of Syrian children through providing services that focus on enhancing education quality such as formal and non-formal education; resources and guides including education in emergencies and child safeguarding guides for educators; capacity building programs in education in emergencies, teachers in crisis contexts, and psycho-social support; awareness sessions for children, based on international standards, such as avoiding remnants of war maintaining personal hygiene, and back to learning campaigns; referral mechanisms within schools to provide vulnerable children with psychological services; and vocational training centers in traditional school spaces to provide youths with professional skills and to enable them to enter the iob market.

Besides providing high quality education services, we also focus on setting the right environment for education so we rehabilitate and renovate schools; provide monthly incentives for teachers and education personnel; provide heaters and fuel for schools during winter; establish safety and security plans and providing schools with safety equipment, such as fire extinguishers and first aid kits; and distribute learning and teaching materials.

- Shelter intervention: IhsanRD promotes for beneficiaries' privacy and improves housing and related community/public infrastructure through providing rehabilitation works to houses and collective centers so that we contribute in warming people's winters and securing their privacy away from the harsh conditions people might suffer in displacement camps or inadequate shelter.
- Non-Food Items: IhsanRD provides essential materials to IDPs and to the most vulnerable families living in dire condition such as blankets, solar lamps, and mattresses, either in-kind or through cash grants.


